

### **PROJECT DETAILS**

### 1. LEADERSHIP

In all 7 villages there is a village development committee formed with elders, youth & women's participation. Each member is given responsibility of a mission topic. Besides this there is a FDG group for every 10 families. VDC committee meets twice in every month, each FDG meets once in one month. Besides there are Self Help Groups 1. Santhosh Nagar 3 Self Help Groups, 2. Gavinivari Palem 3 Self Help Groups, 3. Parvathi Puram 2 Self-help Groups, 4. Vinayaka Nagar 2 Self Help Groups, 5. Mahalakshmi Colony 2 Self Help Groups, 6. Prabhudeva Colony 1 Self Help Group and 7. Kondubotluvari Palem 1 Self Help Group. To empower, to increase their knowledge to improve their communication skills 2 VDC capacity building training camps are conducted. To increase of the knowledge and for improving their livelihoods 1 SHG groups training camp is conducted.

For improvement of skills to have knowledge of the future, livelihood skills, 2-day training camp was conducted for youth of all 7 villages. Competitions are separately conducted for 45 young men & 25 women in sports & games. The winners were given prizes on youth day.

For volunteers also a 2days training camp is conducted in which Mr. Venkat Finance Head & Mr.Shylet Head Operational Excellence acted as resource persons and enlightened the volunteers and how to improve their capacity of their work.

To create awareness of human rights, child rights, women rights etc., Legal awareness camps are conducted with the help of local advocates bar association.




There is a 10 member FDG group for every 10 families who met once in every month discussed about economical living and live with values & ethics.

Some of the VDC members, FDG members attended the Gramasabha and village secretariat and submitted applications for various entitlements beneficial for individual as well as community. Due to the combined efforts of VDC members, FDG members the families who could not get entitlements from governments like Aadhar cards, Ration cards, Job cards, Pensions are meeting the concerned officials could be able to achieve those lacked entitlements. They are also could be able to get the lacked infrastructural facilities by interacting with government officials.


#### 2. EDUCATION

In all villages our C.O's, Remedial Teachers encouraged the children aged between 3-5 years to join in Government Anganwadi. But in Mahalakshmi colony and Prabhudeva colony has Government Anganwadi is 1½ K.M far from village and as the villages are by the side of national highways, heavy traffic we have conducted Balwadi schools in these 2 villages 30 to 35 children from Mahalakshmi colony and 20 to 25 children from Prabhudeva colony. They are given Nutritious Mid-day meal, uniform besides enhancing the senses of the children, driving them towards education. 6 Remedial centres (Evening Tuition Centers) are conducted in 1.Santhosh Nagar, 2.Gavinivari Palem, 3.Parvathi Puram, 4.Vinayaka nagar, 5.Mahalakshmi colony and 6.Kondubotluvari palem. Besides getting them done homework, clarifying the doubts in subjects they are provided nutritious snacks. The dropout children are made to attend regular school or study privately. 65 adults are made to read and write or sign in their mother tongue. 55 Youth are made to learn professional / vocational courses like Driving, Carpentry, Tailoring, and Masonry at senior professionals and have a decent earning, improve their earning capacity. 14 students (Male & Female) are provided help for paying part of college fee, purchasing of instruments Laptop Etc.,

### 3. HEALTH CARE

There is no safe & purified drinking water facility in the villages. In kondubotluvari Palem, Mahalakshmi colony 9 boring pumps are erected for the availability of water to the villagers. In Prabhudeva colony water tank with motor and taps fixed to the tank are made due to these steps the above villager's need of water is satisfied though it is not pure.

Medical camps, Health awareness camps are conducted with the cooperation of local reputed hospitals in all 7 villages. As families in Parvathi puram, Vinayaka nagar, Mahalakshmi colony and Prabhudeva colony are very poor, could not afford money and shy to go to hospitals a community health worker is appointed by GPF to help these poor villagers.

Provided Rs. 5,000/- each as matching grant to 26 poor families for construction of latrines.

To develop the families economically and to lead those to sustainable living, SHG women groups are provided interest free loans, so that they can do petty businesses, raising of goats, buffaloes and such other alternative livelihoods. GPF identified vulnerable families who are very poor and in bad conditions supported 41 of such vulnerable families who are doing petty businesses etc., and increasing their income due to these alternative livelihoods, from all 7 villages 115 families could increase their income. 107 families could be able to do savings in post offices, banks by opening savings account. 61 families could be able to discharge their debts.





### **Care & Support services for 125 Hiv infected patients:**

Through this programme 125 (25 children & 100 adults) received help from GPF & UWL-F. They are provided supplementary nutritious food kits to give them strength and enhance their life period. Out of these 125 35 vulnerable families are given financial support for doing alternative livelihoods. 3 Health counsellors provided their services to these 125 hiv / aids affected patients.

As GPF is slowly making steps of development in the villages, trying to develop their financial, educational, health and living in clean and hygienic circumstances, safe & secure houses villages, making the families to get their entitlements from the government side, now the families and villages in these 7 villages are very happy and a clear change in their lives is apparent. Thus, FFVDP run by GPF as a partner of UWL Foundation is proving a successful way of development of rural areas
