Background

Gramavikasa Peace Foundation

– GPF is a non-profit organization based in Kothakankatapalem, Bapatla, Andhra Pradesh. Established in 1997 with the mission to empower marginalized communities and promote sustainable development through participatory approaches.

MISSION

Encouraging Villagers to attain self-reliance, guide them to live in co-operation and achieve sustainable development.

Objectives

To work for the welfare of downtrodden sections to eradicate social evils such as social discrimination, child labor, in equality of women, child marriages, education to every person, to know their entitlements and rights of society.

Leadership

Under the leadership the following entitlements were achieved by the VDC during this year.

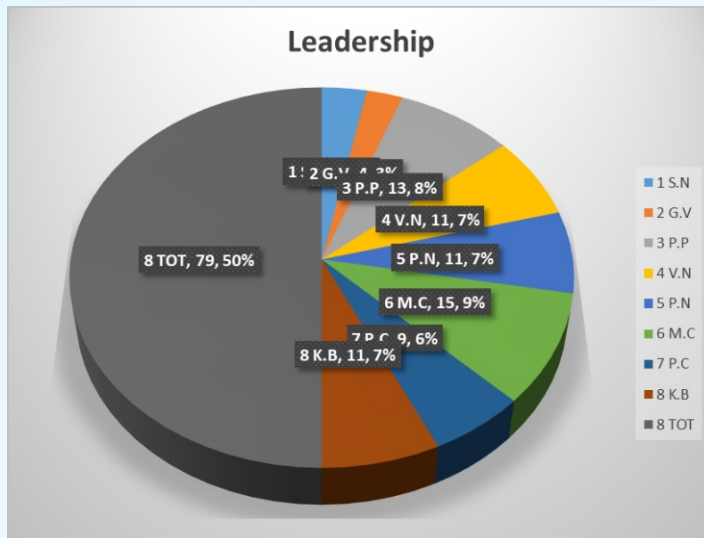
- Achieved Aadhar cards 79 in eight villages
- Achieved ration cards 39 in eight villages
- Opened new bank accounts for 116 individuals
- Government Health insurance cards were issued to 59 families under Arogya Sree.
- Achieved 89 job cards under the MGNREGA scheme
- Achieved 32 new different pensions (Widow, Old age and PHC)
- 109 new voter ID cards achieved
- Achieved 186 community certificates for school going children and community.

Strategy

Family Focused Village Development Program (FFVDP) with the partnership of UWL Foundation. Under this program GPF is working in 8 villages with 6 mission topics that brought changes in villages and families. 1. Leadership 2. Education 3. Household Care 4. Health Care 5. Earnings and Finance and 6. Values and Ethics under the leadership we are doing different activities like access to entitlements conducting of meetings and training sessions to enhance leadership qualities of VDC and FDG exposure visit to model villages.

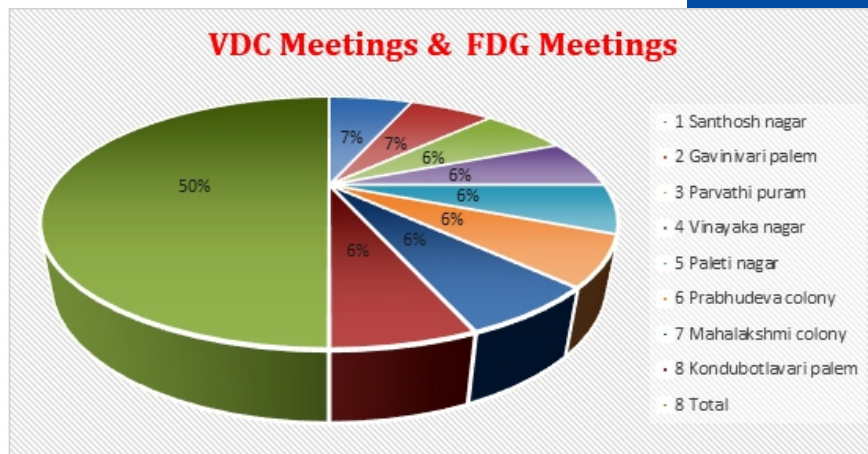


In 8 villages VDC conducted 96 meetings during this year and discussed various issues and given representations to the Government on various issues.

In 8 villages FDG formed 72 groups, each group containing 10 Female, who can meet once in month and discussed about their families and community issues. Planned to be conducted 864 FDG meetings in year. But this year Conducted 762 meetings with FDG's and discussed about children education, Family Issues, Government Schemes, importance of savings and given counselling on various issues with support of different resource persons and sensitized on home building their roles and responsibilities.

Under capacity building training, youth were trained in career guidance trained by John Wesley, MEO office Bapatla on 29.08.2023

Adolescent girls are enlightened on menstrual health management with support from Government health department lead by Dr. Sai Sreecharan, Vetapalem, explained about child marriages, nutrition and what are precautions to be taken at the time of menstrual period and conducted meetings once in three months for 8 villages.

On 22.11.2023, 56 VDC and 7 GPF staff went to exposure visit to Warangal district Gangadevapalli. The village leader Mr. Rajamouli impactfully explained how this village was developed, recognized as model village by the Telangana Government. maintain by the VDC. VDC interacted with the local leaders and how did they develop their village up to this scale. and learned and exchanged ideas. Open defection free and total village have solar power facility and less electricity use. Our VDC members overwhelmed to see this is exchanged ideas.

EDUCATION

92 Village youth from 8 villages went to Araku to know more about tribal culture and living situation. Visited botanical garden and got knowledge about it. Visited tribal museum and visited borra caves and waterfalls at chaparai, on 13.01.2024.



On 27.01.2024, 106 School going children from 8 villages went to excursion Kondaveedu to know the history Kondaveedu Kingdom visited, Vijayawada to improve their knowledge and have visited Ambedkar statue at Vijayawada and also importance other places in Vijayawada.





GPF conducts after school study centers in 8 villages with 234 children. Boys -89 and Girls -145, 1st standard to 10th standard. There we provide computer basic knowledge and digital education through smart TVs.



- We ensured no dropouts of children in school / high school
- Organized village children's libraries in 7 villages, each library 140 books. Children read books regularly.
- Career guidance sessions are conducted periodically for the 10th class students.



- 27 students were given financial assistance from GPF for different further studies, like B.Ed. -1, Engineering - 3, Degree - 5, Lab Technician -1, Diploma-1, Intermediate -5, School going children -9 supported with cycles, Computer Training in Python course-1, ANM Nursing Course- 1.



Vocational Training

- In four villages 15 youth provided vocational training in learning Driving and support them to get License.
- In three villages 13 women provided vocational training in tailoring
- Course of three months duration
- In two villages Paletinagar and Santhosh Nagar. After school study centers are constructed with the support of the VDC and equipped with Computer, Smart TV and Library with 214 books.
- Provided educational Revolving fund amount of Rs.2,00,000/- in Vinayaka Nagar, Gavinivaripalem and Santhosh Nagar for children's further education support and ASSC sustainability.
- Provided 5 laptops and recruited one computer instructor to conduct computer classes for children and village youth in 5 villages. In each village conducted computer education classes 45days in five villages and 111 benefitted from this program (From September2023 to March2024)

Community Educators Training (CEs)

Mr Naveen, Resource person from Hyderabad conducted training to community Educators. The program got through 3 sessions of two days at Eco house bapatla. 8 community educators actively participated and benefited from this program. They got knowledge

- How to engage the community, how to bring the children to the center, what programs to do, how to identify the behaviors of the children in 1st session.
- He "feeling Tree" and exhibited explained about the feeling tree, through this picture, he explained about the types of feelings in children, long term feelings and short-term feelings and how to overcome them in 2nd session.

2nd day Session

- How to develop Leadership qualities in children and how to face any problems arise from children are taught in 3rd session.
- Four types of model activities are done, main bottlenecks in after school study center how to develop unity among children, Benefits of reading newspapers and methods of teaching to be adopted.

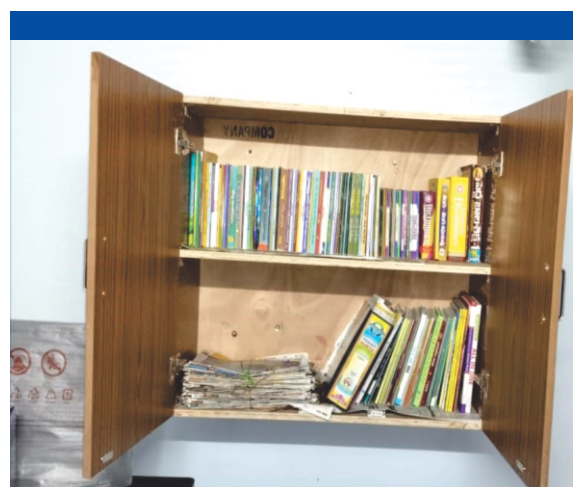




CEs Training Camp on Teaching Methods

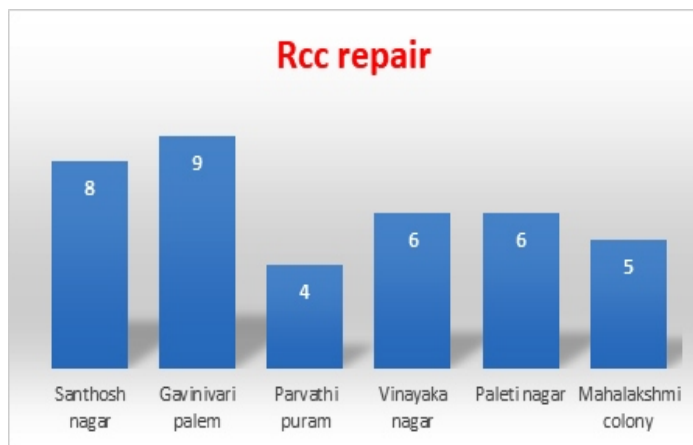


Village Library

Household Care

The focus of this mission topic is for all families to live in safe, secure and livable houses and environments. They should be aware of a balanced nutritional diet that keeps them healthy in good conditions in accordance with the above policies.

In six villages 38 houses are repaired like RCC roof, Inside and outside plastering, Flooring work, two houses' doors fixed.



In three villages 6 pre-fabricated houses were constructed for the most vulnerable families. In prabhudevacy - 2, Mahalakshmicolony-2, and Kondubotlapalem -2.

Kitchen garden

In 8 villages 350 families raised kitchen gardens in natural farming methods. They produced vegetables- 905kgs, and greens- 1290kgs and fruits. Families' self-consumption and shared extra vegetables with other families and sold in the market. People enjoyed and consumed well and wellbeing with good health with good nutritional food.

Monthly once in three months, i.e. last Saturday all the villagers participated in the whole village cleaning program. (Now Government program Swachh - hi- Bharat)



Healthcare Service

Under this mission topic 38 toilets were repaired in six villages. Santhoshnagar-4, Parvathipuram -2. Vinayaka Nagar -4, Paletinagar -16, Prabhudevacolony-6, and Mahalakshmi colony -6. The following repairs were done. Roof repairs, doors repairs, inside and outside plastering work, Flooring work, Changed the seats, two new Septic tanks with cement rings, height raising, whitewashing work done.

New toilets were constructed in six villages, 22 toilets. Santhoshnagar -6, Gavinivaripalem-4. Vinayakanagar-3, Paletinagar – 4, Mahalakshmi colony -3 and Kondubotlavaripalem-2.



Three Bore wells were dug in three villages for drinking water purpose. Paletinagr-1, Mahalakshminagr-1 and kondubotlavaripalem -1. Around the well was kept one cement ring annexing a pit for wastewater.

MHM Awareness program

In 8 villages conducted 16 awareness campaigns on Menstruation Health issues. With help from Government health department supplied packets of napkin pads to young women. Food Science and Technology College, Bapatla staff conducted training on importance of the Nutritional food in our office campus. Participated 48 villagers in these training sessions. In three villages our community health worker was working. Paletinagar, Prabhudev colony and Mahalakshmi Colony. Explained about cleanliness, prevention care, First Aid and in emergency cases guide them and send them to Government hospitals for further treatment.

Earnings and Finance

Under this mission topic we were able to support 20 families with Livelihoods units to enhance income and improve.

- **Paletinagar** supported 5 families with Fishing Nets -3, Ricksha- 1, Musical Drums-1,
- **Prabhu Deva colony** – 5 families supported Goats & Sheep's -2, Mobile drinks-1, and Tiffen Centre -1, Aluminum vessels -1
- **Mahalakshmi Colony** - 6 families supported with cutting Machine -1, Ricksha-1, petty shop- 1, and Fishing Nets -2, Rattraps -1
- **Kondabolu Palem** – 4 families supported Poultry-2, Ricksha-1, Rattraps-1,

Under financial Literacy 8 villages 210 families participated and benefited in different training programs.

POs distributed income and expenditure books to all villagers and encouraged them to write daily. After one month verified and explained in one month how much they earned and how much they spent, prepared the income and expenditure statement and explained to them to go for the necessary expenditures and leave the unnecessary expenditures and where they can reduce and where they can save. Villagers are very impressed with the comparative income and expenditure statement and felt very happy. Now they can be able to save monthly. 40 families are very impressed with income and expenditure books and saving a lot of money. Through this financial awareness 31 families continuously managed their finances and reduced their long pending debts.

- All the villagers celebrated religious festivals and inclusiveness improved
- FDG, Youth Clubs, VDC meetings, all CBOs are enlightened to follow ethics and Values which makes betterment in quality of life.
- Disadvantages of social evils customs, like denying education to girlchild, girl child marriage, illiteracy and bad habits, etc.
- Encouraged children to exhibit good messages, skits, songs on above subjects in school events.

Project Officers Training

Four project officers attended two days training in Hyderabad, at Archdiocese social service society.

Session 1. how to engage in the community and how to identify the bottlenecks that are being faced. Through awareness program and by contacting the government officials and also making the officials to get engaged with the community, in this way to know, how to solve their problem at the ground level.

In session2 explained about two activities. How to attract children to after school study centers and what are the problems they are facing.

In session3 explained and informed what the strategies that should be used to develop the education sector.

In session4 two activities explained with participation of Pos. By this Pos got knowledge how to engage with the village children and how to engage with the community.


